

Academic writing is a process related to contexts which emerged in academic fields; writing focused on introducing ideas, defending thesis, presenting arguments and counter arguments, building conclusions, organizing ideas around different topics and so. It's communication based on building knowledge. It has to be something you have thought, you have processed and you have prepare to present it. It is not the activity of writing itself, but writing aimed to build knowledge. You use it to learn, to share what you have learnt, and to teach others.





### Common types of academic writing

Notes: A written record of the main points of a text or lecture, for a student's personal use.

Report: A description of something a student has done (e.g. conducting a survey).

Project: A piece of research, either individual or group work, with the topic chosen by the student(s).

Essay: The most common type of written work, with the title given by the teacher, normally 1,000-5,000 words.

Dissertation/Thesis: The longest piece of writing normally done by a student (20,000+ words) often for a higher degree, on a topic chosen by the student.

Paper: A general term for any academic essay, report, presentation or article.

### **Structure of Academic Writing**

- Introduction (thesis statement)
- Paragraph 1 (paragraph leader)

- Paragraph 2 (paragraph leader)

### **Structure of Academic Writing**


Abstract A short summary that explains the paper's purpose and main findings.

References A list of all the sources the writer has mentioned in the text.

**Literature**Part of the main body in which the views of other writers on the topic are discussed.

Case study A section where one particular example is described in detail.
